













# JULY/AUGUST 2019 IN REVIEW

There's one word to describe The Banks in July and August: active! While the calendar moved closer to the end summer, the weather brought a season's worth of sunshine—perfect for every kind of indoor and outdoor activity along the banks of the Ohio.

In July, Phase IIIB infrastructure construction began with boring a series of test piles in Lot D. Planet Fitness and Smoothie King held grand openings. World Cup Village hosted US Women's Soccer fans, celebrating Cincinnatian Rose Lavelle and her teammates for a fourth World Cup win. The "Sample Space" at 195 Walnut premiered as a short-term retail or display space and for hosting special events. The Roebling Bridge closed to traffic until a cure for falling debris could be found. Crosswalk repairs were made on Vine Street and Mehring Way. Skystar Wheel announced plans for a long-term home at The Banks.

In August, Phase IIIB moved from the test pile stage to drilling of production piles for construction of the public infrastructure. Bengals Training Camp, Celtic Fest and Whispering Beard Fest drew crowds to The Banks. The Roebling Bridge re-opened to traffic, while work on Fishbowl continued. Joint Banks Steering Committee announced a new office building for 180 Walnut. Variable Message Signage proceeded to shop drawing, permit and material procurement.





Combined Minority and Women Workforce Participation

Female: 1.82%Minority: 16.01%

Workers living within the 26-county Consolidated Metropolitan Statistical Area represented 80.1% of the construction workforce. There are no local residency participation goals for the project.



**Disadvantaged Business Enterprise (DBE)** goal/ participation varied by project, between 4% and 9%. \$5,687,667 paid to DBE contractors

#### SAFETY

Public Parties construction safety hours for Phase I, II, IIIA and IIIB totaled **802,556** without a lost-time incident (from January 1, 2008 through August 31, 2019).

Developer construction safety hours for Phase I, II, IIIA and IIIB totaled **953,818** without a lost-time incident (from January 1, 2008 through August 31, 2019).

## BUDGET

Phase IIIA budget expended totaled **88.8%** of the \$29.3 million total through August 31, 2019.

The Public Parties project work remained within budget.


